
**Example: Pursue Your Goals in Assignments**

Level: Undergraduate

## Set-Up

I asked students to write at least one personal goal they want to pursue through preparing their assignment. If it was something I could give them feedback on, I asked them to write it at the top of their essay.



## **Results**

Below are examples of students' goals on this assignment:

"Clear formulation of arguments, precise use of language, and clear, logical sentences that are not too long."

"My personal goal for this essay is to actually enjoy doing the assignment, to not worry about the grade too much, to acknowledge that there is no definite right or wrong when it comes to essay-writing, and that therefore I don't have to contemplate over every little detail and formulation, which only leads to frustration and takes away the excitement and real learning."

"The topic is complicated, as the study is about teenage pregnancy, but actually talks more about communication with locals. Therefore, I want to try to structure it in a way that makes sense and is coherent."

"At the end of this semester I am really exhausted and don't feel motivated. To make it more interesting, my goals was to come up with a more creative format than the normal essay structure with intro, thesis statement and conclusion. I came up with a panel format, where there are different speakers who give talks on the same topic but from different perspectives. I hope this is fine since the assignment instructions call for creativity."
